# IN 2020, THE BERGEN COUNTY FOOD SECURITY TASK FORCE WAS FORMED

SPEARHEADED BY BERGEN COUNTY COMMISSIONER TRACY ZUR, THE TASK FORCE WAS FORMED AS A RESPONSE TO UNPRECEDENTED LEVELS OF FOOD INSECURITY DURING THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC. THE ORIGINAL GOALS OF THE TASK FORCE INCLUDED:

Respond to immediate emergency

Create a network of food providers

Improve supply chain for healthy options

Improve public awareness of food insecurity

Improve outcomes for food insecure families

#### Becoming the Office of Food Security





In 2023, the Bergen County Food Security Task Force became the Bergen County Office of Food Security – a permanent office with the Bergen County Department of Human Services.

The Office of Food Security serves as a resource connector for food pantries and their clients, helping them access important information about key services in Bergen County.

OFS also works to achieve the original goals of the Food Security Task Force:

- Modernizing pantry operations through Bergen County Oasis Insights network & helping pantries make direct referrals for clients using software
- Building capacity through \$1.6M in grant awards from Bergen County Food Pantry
   Sustainability Grant Program
- Creating networking opportunities for pantries through the Bergen County Food Pantry Summit & Food Security Office Hours
- Raise public awareness about food insecurity through events like Canstruction, the Bergen County Soup-er Bowl, and Hunger Action Month







In Essex County, New Jersey, a county-wide coalition focusing on food insecurity as a key social determinant of health and working collaboratively across sectors and with communities to advance health equity and achieve collective impact.

# Food & Health Equity Coalition

#### **Mission & Vision**

**The mission** of the Food & Health Equity Coalition of Essex County is to increase and improve food access, security, and sovereignty through collaboration, advocacy, education, and coordination of resources.

We envision a future where communities across Essex County have the access and ability to acquire the food and nutrition they need and want through sustainable food systems which are informed and driven by the communities they serve.

## **Coalition Goals**

- Engage a diverse group of stakeholders, including the development of a Community Advisory Board, to identify the greatest barriers to food security impacting communities in Essex County, NJ.
- Compile and assess existing food access resources in Essex County and develop a plan to centralize, maintain, and share comprehensive, relevant, and accurate food access resources.
- Build working groups to address the greatest barriers to food security in Essex County. The working groups will include experts and professionals, as well as community members with lived experience.







# **Current Issues Being Discussed**


- > Ensuring food & nutrition resources are **easily accessible**, **accurate and maintained**, for providers and community members seeking services


